



Food Distribution Programs Operating During the Coronavirus Crisis

The San Diego Food Bank's food distribution programs will continue to serve those in need throughout the duration of the Coronavirus crisis. Below are lists of our food distributions scheduled for the month of October 2020.

Super Pantry Program

Super Pantries are food distribution hubs located across San Diego County that offer both contactless "drive-thru" and "walk-up" food distribution services. All Super Pantries are open for food distribution a minimum of 3 days per week.

Individuals and families in need of food assistance can visit your nearest Super Pantry during opening hours to receive emergency groc resources.

Emergency Food Assistance Program

The San Diego Food Bank's *Emergency Food Assistance Program* distributes emergency food packages at 90 different locations across S County every month. The majority of the food distributed at these sites includes nonperishable and shelf-stable food items. To qualify program, your household must meet federal income guidelines (listed in the document of distribution locations).
