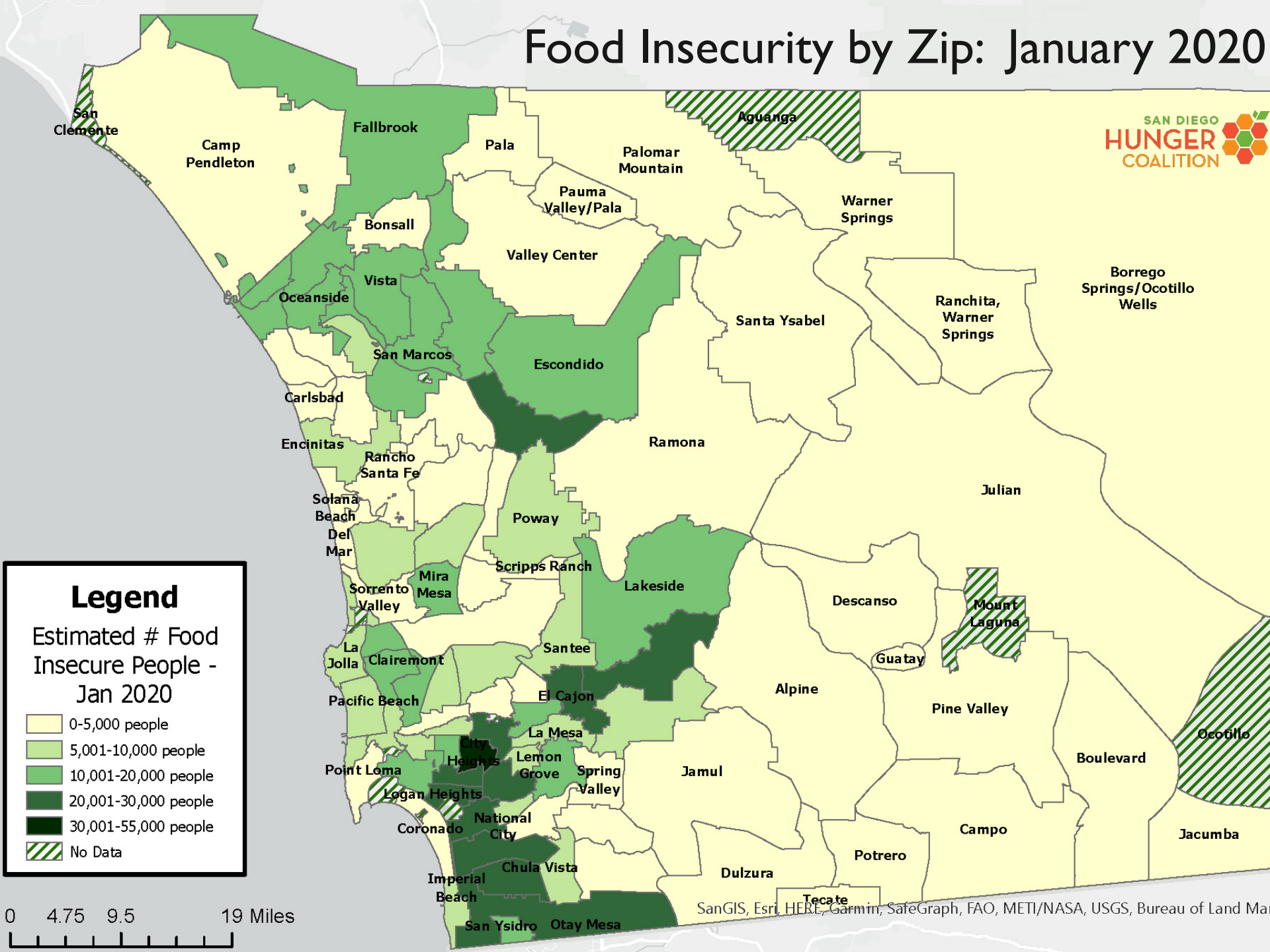

Legend

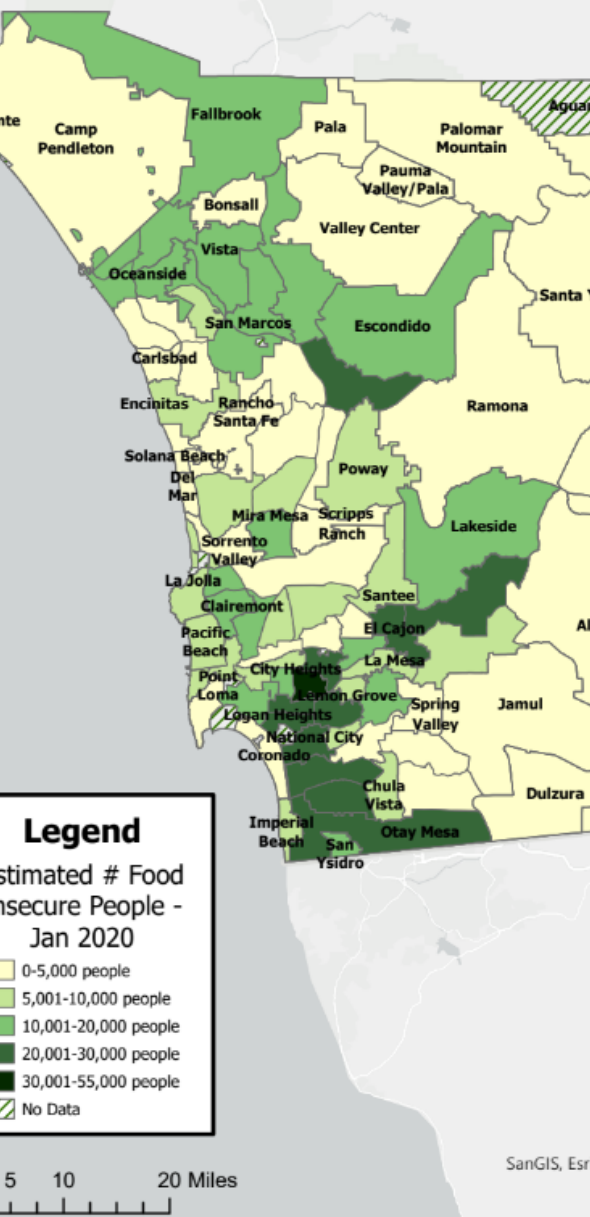

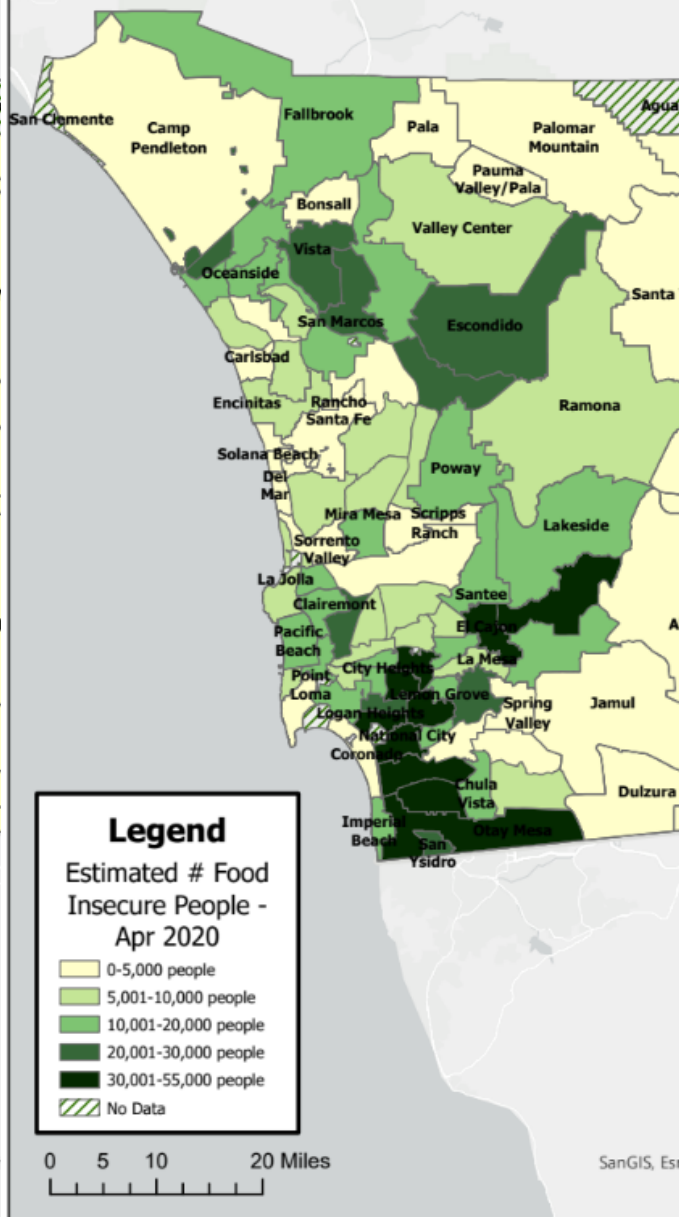

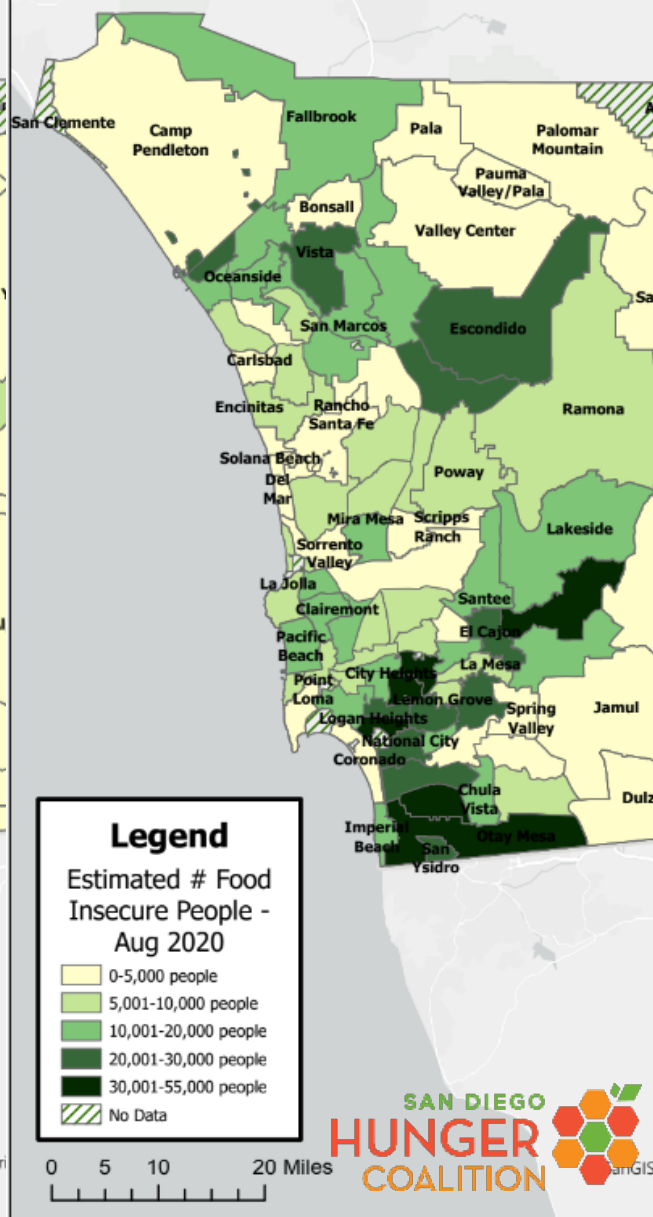

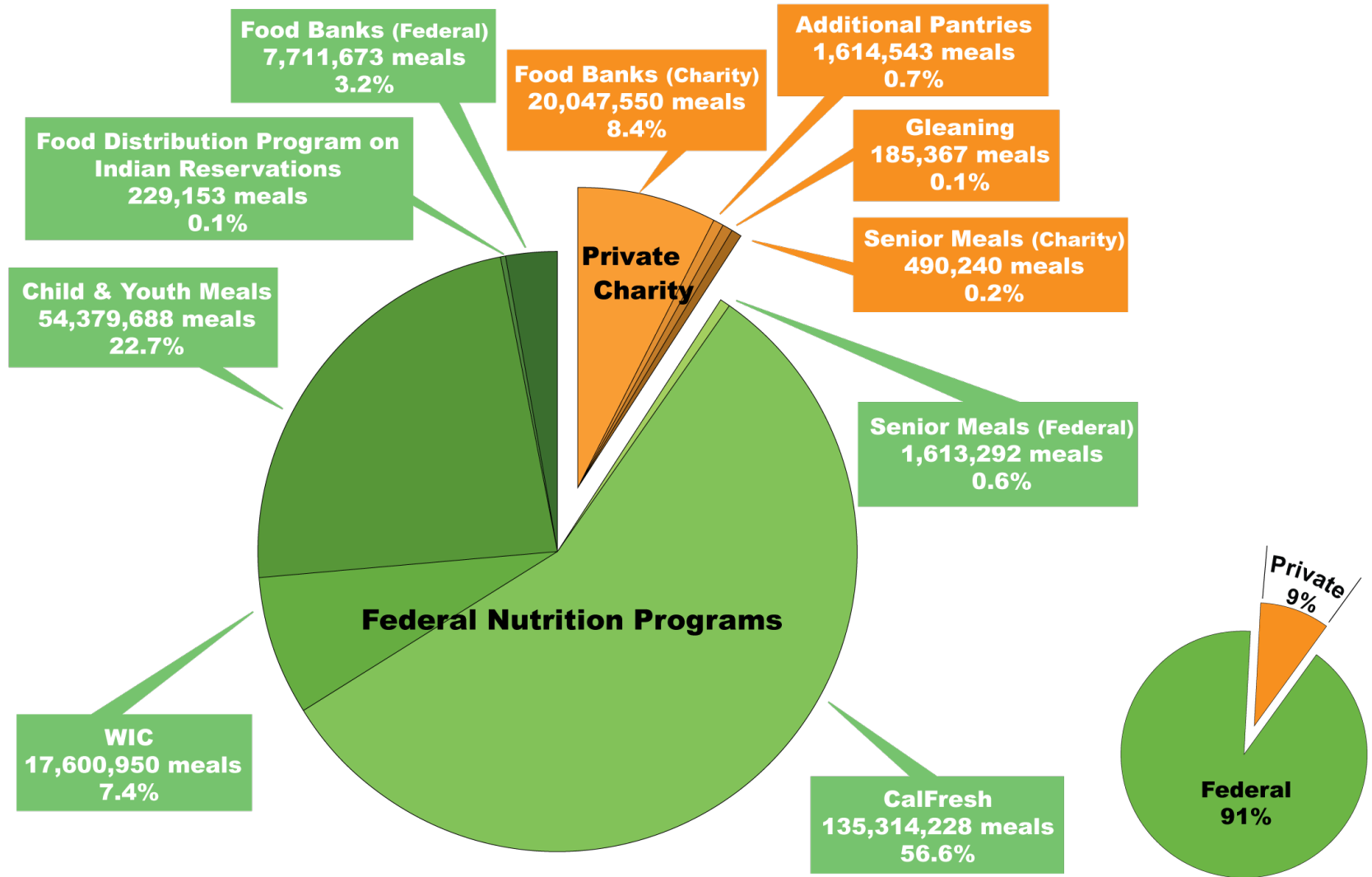



CalFresh **CalFresh (SNAP)**

* CalFresh provides cash benefits for grocery buying for food while benefits are open.
* CalFresh provides grocery benefits on a debit-like card that can be used at grocery stores and farmers markets.
* High-value CalFresh cards will be used to purchase food items at participating retailers.
* The majority of people who are eligible for CalFresh (SNAP) are exempt from the Public Charge Rule.
